Acknowledge alarms

Acknowledging alarms means confirmation of current alarms (alarm object in Alarm state) by the operator. Acknowledgement of an alarm changes its status to a **Normal** state. But you can also acknowledge the next alarm state – Unacknowledged. This state occurs for an *Alarm* type object which is defined as an acknowledgement-required alarm at its configuration in the D2000 CNF process, when the condition to raise alarm is not met.

To acknowledge an alarm

- 1. In the Alarm list window (1st or 2nd tabs), select an alarm (or a selection of alarms) in Alarm or Unacknowledged states.
- 2. Click the button Acknowledge. The alarm may be acknowledged by double-clicking its name or by pressing the Spacebar key.

Alarm acknowledgement is presented by the change of the alarm graphic symbol to 🔨 symbol. In case the acknowledged alarm is the last active one in the system then the visual and audible alert will stop after its acknowledgement.
